NCHSAA Division II Championship:

1982: 4A - Asheville 21, Greenville Rose 7 Under Coach Bruce Peterson AHS finished the regular season 9-1, with the only blemish a one-point loss to Western 4-A Conference champion Ashbrook. (Placed in the two-week 4-A Division II playoffs, AHS defeated Charlotte Independence and quarterback Mark Maye, the state's player of the year, 50-29, with 1,000-yard rushers Scott Roberts and Pete Calhoun scoring three touchdowns each.)

Player, and Then Coach, In State Championship:

Mickey Ray is the only person to play on a State Championship team (Division II, 1982) and coach on another (Assistant Coach, 2005). Ralph James played on the 1922 State Championship team and was head coach (1941-44) but never won a State Championship. However, his team was National Runner-up in 1941.
