NCHSAA Division II Championship:

1982: 4A - Asheville 21, Greenville Rose 7 Under Coach Bruce Peterson AHS finished the regular season 9-1, with the only blemish a one-point loss to Western 4-A Conference champion Ashbrook. (Placed in the two-week 4-A Division II playoffs, AHS defeated Charlotte Independence and quarterback Mark Maye, the state's player of the year, 50-29, with 1,000-yard rushers Scott Roberts and Pete Calhoun scoring three touchdowns each.)

Player, and Then Coach, In State Championship:

Mickey Ray is the only person to play on a State Championship team (Division II, 1982) and coach on another (Assistant Coach, 2005). Ralph James played on the 1922 State Championship team and was head coach (1941-44) but never won a State Championship. However, his team was National Runner-up in 1941.

Greatest Comeback Victory:

2011: At A. C. Reynolds, September 23, 2011: Asheville trailed A.C. Reynolds 29-0, and scored for the first time with 6 seconds remaining in the first half. In less than 14 minutes, Asheville held Reynolds scoreless and went ahead by the final winning margin of 35-29.

Greatest Opponent Comeback Victory:

2004: Asheville led Concord 20-0 at Concord High with 5:43 left in the 4th quarter of the 3A Semifinal game. Concord came back to win 21-20 led by the passing of Tommy Beecher. Concord went on to win the State Championship.

2002: Asheville led Ashbrook at home late in the 3AA semifinal game but lost 22-19 in overtime. Ashbrook went on to win the State Championship.
